

Pastor's Letter

July 27, 2025—17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

Last Sunday we heard two stories of hospitality. From Genesis we read the story of Abraham welcoming three divine guests who had a message for him and his wife Sarah regarding God's promise to make his descendants a great nation and from the Gospel of Luke we read about Martha and Mary who welcomed Jesus to their home. Today we learn something about one of the gifts that comes to those who welcome God with an open heart: the gift of closeness to God in prayer.

Our first reading for today picks up right where we left off last Sunday. The three visitors are about to leave Abraham and go down to Sodom and Gomorrah to bring God's judgment on their evil behavior. Abraham enters into a give-and-take with God, pleading for mercy. After opening his heart and home to God, God shares his own heart with Abraham and tells him what he is about to do. A relationship has been established. Dialogue has begun. It all started with Abraham welcoming God into his life.

The Gospel reading for today also follows right after the story of Martha and Mary and also deals with prayer. Jesus' disciples ask him to teach them to pray and Jesus responds by giving them what we have come to call the Our Father or Lord's Prayer. The prayer is so simple and yet so profound. In it we claim our place as children of our heavenly Father, share with him our everyday, ordinary concerns, and ask him to help us grow in holiness and participate in his kingdom. Here we learn that for the one who welcomes God, nothing is too big or too small to ask. Just as we talk to a friend about anything and everything going on in our lives, we can share everything with God in prayer.

Offering God the hospitality of our hearts is the first step in developing a strong relationship with him through prayer.

Make sure you say the "Our Father" every day to praise God our Father and ask Him for everything you need.


The Prayer
