# Pastor's Letter

March 15, 2026 – 4th Sunday of Lent

Dear Church Family,

A long time ago I read a book by an author named Eugene Petersen. One of the things that he said in the book, *Working the Angles*, that has always stuck with me is that preachers are not called by the church to tell new stories. They are called to remind their people of old stories that they have heard many times before. We need to hear over and over again the timeless stories of love, truth, goodness, and beauty contained in God's Word. These are the stories that feed our souls throughout our lives because at every stage of our lives they reveal something new to us about the meaning of life.

One of the things that we need to continually be reminded of is who we are in the Lord. In our second reading for today, St. Paul tells us, "You are light in the Lord," and that we are called to live as children of the light. Each of us who has put on Christ is called to brighten the world with the light of the love that we have received from Christ by imitating his generous giving of himself to others out of love for the Father. Jesus called himself the light of the world, and we are called to walk in his light.

The light that Christ shines on the world shows us the way things really are. It shows us how God holds everything together in being by his love. It shows us our weaknesses and strengths and the hope that is ours when we align ourselves with his plan for the renewal of all creation. It helps us avoid the traps of self-centeredness, pride, and fear that can keep us from experiencing the fullest joy possible in this life and the life to come.

In our Gospel reading for today we read the story of a man whose eyes have been opened to faith in Jesus Christ. In the light of his new faith, he begins to see everything in a new way and is able to stand up to the challenges that come his way. As we move through life, the light of Christ reveals God's solutions to the challenges and temptations that we ourselves face, whatever they may be. May our path always be illuminated by the light of God's love as we follow along the way of discipleship and service. And may the light that guides us shine through us. May we become light in the Lord to help others find their way to real peace and happiness in the kingdom of our heavenly Father.

When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.



## Saint Joseph

This Thursday, March 19th, is the feast day of Saint Joseph. He is one of the greatest saints in the Church. The Bible doesn't tell us very much about him, but we know that he was very obedient and trusted God, and that he must have been a very holy man- God chose him to look after His own Son, Jesus!

Saint Joseph was just a poor Jewish carpenter, but God saw that he was a very good man so He chose him to be the husband and protector of Mary, who would be the Mother of Jesus. Saint Joseph provided for Mary by his hard work.



When Jesus was born Saint Joseph protected Him from the evil King Herod, who wanted to kill Him. He spent his days working to support Jesus and Mary and taught Jesus how to be a carpenter. Saint Joseph was Jesus' teacher, but he also learned from Jesus how to be holy.

Saint Joseph died a holy and peaceful death in the arms of Jesus and Mary. Now he is in Heaven, helping us when we pray to him. We should pray to him because he is a great protector and teacher for us, just like he was for Jesus.
