# Pastor's Letter

# July 6, 2025—14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

In our Gospel reading for today, Jesus sends out seventy-two of his disciples to go out ahead of him and prepare people to receive him. He gives them instructions that show that they should rely totally on God to protect them and to take care of their needs along the way. And he gives them the message that they are to proclaim; "The kingdom of God is at hand." It's interesting to note that this message is the same whether the place they enter welcomes them or not, with one small but important difference.

Jesus tells them, "Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.'" He also tells them, "Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand." Did you notice the difference? It's those two little words, for you.

Those two words are very important. The kingdom of God is coming. That is true whether or not we believe the good news of Jesus Christ. The day is coming when God will reclaim and renew all things. That reality has begun to break into the world right now because of our Lord's life, death, and resurrection. The only question is, am I going to be a part of this great work of God? Is the kingdom of God at hand for me?

If I welcome Jesus into my life and allow him to live in me and produce the fruit of faith, hope and love, then the eternal and abundant life of God's kingdom is for me. If I keep Jesus at arm's length and don't allow him to help me grow in holiness, I will always be outside the circle of love that is the kingdom of God.

With every day that passes, we are one day closer to the coming of God's kingdom. Every day is an opportunity to welcome Jesus by acts of devotion to him and acts of kindness to our fellow human beings. If we welcome him, he will welcome us, and his kingdom will be for us.
