Pastor's Letter

February 16, 2025—6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

One of the defining characteristics of the time in which we live is a sense of dissatisfaction with the way things are in the world. The roots of our frustration go much deeper than any current circumstances we might find ourselves facing, as our Scripture readings for today remind us. At base, our problem comes from not knowing who we are, why we are here, or where we are going. Without this basic knowledge about ourselves, we don't know who we can trust to help us get where we need to go. Without the proper goals for our lives we will never be happy. And without the right help we will never achieve those goals.

St. Paul, in our second reading for today tells us that, "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ we are the most pitiable people of all." If we are only trying to "make it" in this world, according to this world's standards, we are wasting our lives. We were made for a better life, the resurrected life that Jesus now lives, life without pain or sorrow, life without end. The world can't give us this kind of life. We can't buy it and no human being can give it to us. We can only receive it from God when we walk the path of discipleship that Jesus showed us. When we live lives of faith in Christ, hope for the future the Father has promised us, and love for God and neighbor that is the mark of the kingdom of God, then we will find the peace and joy that comes from having a life that is going somewhere worthwhile. Life lived only in pursuit of what this world calls success is just another trip around the hamster wheel.

The restlessness we feel with this present way of things is not just a symptom of life without meaning. It is also a motivation to do something different, to give ourselves to something more. That's why Jesus says that the ones who are poor, hungry, weeping and persecuted now are the lucky ones. Our suffering in this life is pushing us to strive for something better. It's a sign to us from God that we deserve more than this. We were made for eternity, and nothing less than God is ever going to satisfy us. May we never settle just for what this life has to offer. May all our trust be placed in God alone.

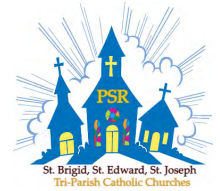
Stewardship Reflection

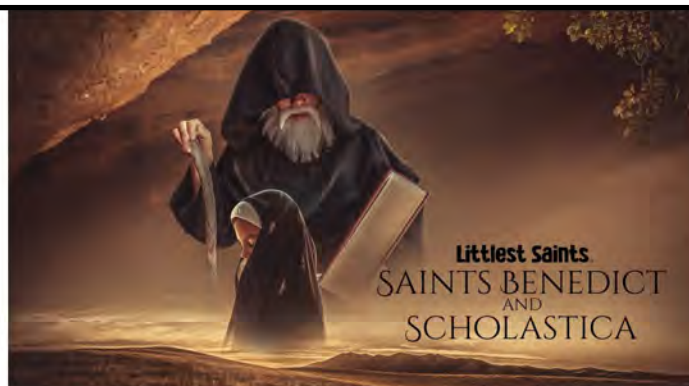
Sunday, February 16 Readings - FOR YOUTH!
