# Pastor's Letter

# August 24, 2025—21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

In our Gospel lesson for today we read about someone knocking on God's door asking to be let in. Two weeks ago we heard a similar story, but with a very different conclusion. That story was a teaching about prayer. If you go to your friend when you are in need, even in the middle of the night, your friend will help you if you keep asking persistently. Likewise, God will answer our prayers if we keep asking.

Our reading for today is a story about the final judgment. One day, the door to the kingdom of heaven will be closed and locked and many will be knocking and asking for entrance, but the Lord will refuse to open to them saying, "I do not know where you are from."

Why the different reaction from God? The difference is that in the first parable, it's a friend that is doing the knocking and seeking help. There is a relationship already established that allows the one in need to come with confidence to God in prayer. In the second parable, there is no such relationship with God. The ones left outside say, "We met at a dinner party once and we heard you talking in the street when you passed through our town," but that's not a real friendship.

Jesus tells us that we must strive to enter the kingdom of God "through the narrow gate." That gate is friendship with God through faith in Jesus Christ. If we want to enjoy the blessings of God now and in the life to come, we have to do more than just tip our hats to God every once in awhile by going to Mass occasionally or tossing up a prayer when we think of it or doing a good deed every now and then. Friendship with God requires the same kind of attention as any other important relationship in our lives. We spend time with him in prayer and worship. We receive the gifts of grace he gives in the sacraments and we offer him the gift of ourselves in love and service. If we live in the presence of God now, we can have hope for the future and for eternity. God always opens the door for his friends.


# Saint Junipero Serra August 28









# **Being Punished...**

In today's second reading, Saint Paul wrote to the Hebrews about being disciplined by God. When we are young God wants our parents to make sure we behave well. When we don't behave He wants them to discipline us so that we will learn to be good. Our parents don't punish us just because they are angry at us; they do it because they really love us and want us to learn to be better. Saint Paul says that the Lord disciplines the people that He loves.

Being punished is a painful thing, but we will be happy once we have learned our lesson and become a better person. Saint Paul says, "make straight path for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed." He means that when you are punished, you should stop doing the wrong thing so that you won't be hurt worse from the punishment, but will get better instead. So next time you are disciplined or punished, remember that God is allowing it to help you become a better person. If you can, even thank God for giving you the chance to make up for your sin and learn a good lesson!
