Nov. 30, 2025—1st Sunday of Advent

Dear Church Family,

"For our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed." Romans 13:11

One of the blessings of being a Christian is knowing that history is going somewhere. Many people today suffer from a lack of meaning in their lives. They think that human beings are just a product of random chance, an accidental collision of chemicals that evolved over billions of years resulting in you and me. The universe has no purpose or goal or direction. It's pretty hard to have hope for the future when you don't believe there is any point to your existence.

The Christian faith teaches that our lives do have a point. We are here for a reason: to love and serve God and enjoy life in his presence forever. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together." (Col. 1:15-17) Everything comes from him and everything is moving back to him. Love is our origin and love is our endpoint. May love be the driving force that gives meaning to our lives and brings us home.

or you can call any camper. Thank you for your continued support!


